SUBJECT: THOMAS MASSIE HAS AN OVERWHELMING LEAD IN THE REPUBLICAN PRIMARY
IN KENTUCKY CD-4 WITH 70% OF THE VOTE

DATE: APRIL 29, 2020

A recent poll of Kentucky CD 4 Republican Primary Voters conducted by WPAi on behalf of Club for Growth PAC shows that Thomas Massie has an overwhelming lead with 70% of the vote. Todd McMurtry's controversies over anti-Trump statements have driven his unfavorable ratings up to twice his favorable ratings.

Thomas Massie is well-liked by Republican primary voters while Todd McMurtry has a significantly net-negative image.

Thomas Massie's image is strong. Nearly two-in-three Republican primary voters have favorable impressions of him. Recent public controversies about Todd McMurtry's anti-Trump online posts have already damaged his image, as twice as many primary voters have unfavorable impressions of him as have favorable impressions of him.

Massie leads on the Republican Primary ballot with 70% of the vote.

Massie has an overwhelming lead on the primary ballot with 70 percent of the vote compared to just 13 percent for McMurtry. Only 17% of Republican primary voters are undecided.

Methodology

WPAi conducted a poll of $n = 407$ likely Republican Primary voters in Kentucky CD 4. Interviews were conducted via live telephone interview from April 27-28, 2020; 55% of the interviews were conducted to cell phones and 45% to landline phones. The survey has a margin of error of $\pm 4.9\%$. The sample was selected from the voter file and stratified by age, gender, and geography to ensure accurate representation of the electorate.
