A WPA Intelligence poll conducted on behalf of Club for Growth PAC in Arizona from April 5-6, 2021, shows Andy Biggs in a strong position in the primary election for U.S. Senate. Biggs leads by a single point head-to-head against Doug Ducey despite a name ID disadvantage and leads by double digits among voters who know about both candidates and have opinions of both.

Andy Biggs leads by a single point in a head-to-head race with Doug Ducey despite a name ID disadvantage.

In a head-to-head primary, Biggs would lead with 46% of the vote to 45% for Doug Ducey with nine percent undecided. Biggs leads despite a name ID disadvantage.

- Ducey has 98% name ID among Republican primary voters.
- Biggs has lower name ID at 77%.

Biggs leads by more among votes with more information about the two candidates.

- Among the 77% of primary voters who have heard of both candidates, Biggs leads by 11 points.
- Among the 58% of primary voters with opinions of both, Biggs leads by 20.

If President Trump endorsed Andy Biggs, it would give him a commanding lead in the primary race.

If Trump endorsed Biggs, he would lead by 27 points with 59% of the vote in a head-to-head vote. Ducey would maintain just 32% of the vote and 9% would be undecided.

Methodology

WPAi conducted a poll of n = 505 likely Republican primary voters in Arizona. Interviews were conducted by live telephone interviewers April 5-6, 2021; 64% of the interview were conducted to cell phones and 36% to landline phones. The sample was selected from the Arizona voter file and stratified by geography, age, gender, and vote history to ensure a representative sample of the likely primary electorate. The survey has a margin of error of $\pm 4.4\%$ at the 95% confidence level.
