SUBJECT: RECENT PULSE POLL SHOWS THAT MIKE MAZZEI LEADS BY SIX POINTS IN THE REPUBLICAN PRIMARY RUNOFF FOR OKLAHOMA GOVERNOR

DATE: JUNE 24, 2026

A Pulse Decision Science poll of n = 606 likely Republican primary runoff voters in Oklahoma, conducted June 21-23, 2026, shows that Mike Mazzei leads by six points. Mazzei has a strong positive image while Gentner Drummond’s unfavorables are equal to his favorables and Mazzei is seen as the more conservative candidate in the race.

MIKE MAZZEI LEADS THE RUNOFF BY SIX POINTS.

- Mazzei leads with 44% of the vote.
- Gentner Drummond trails at 38% and 18% of runoff voters are undecided.

MIKE MAZZEI’S FAVORABLES ARE 19 POINTS HIGHER THAN HIS UNFAVORABLES WHILE DRUMMOND’S UNFAVORABLES ARE AS HIGH AS HIS FAVORABLES.

- Mazzei has 92% name ID with 48% of runoff voters holding favorable opinions of him and just 29% with unfavorable opinions.
- Gentner Drummond, on the other hand, has 43% favorable ratings and 43% unfavorable.

MIKE MAZZEI IS SEEN AS THE CONSERVATIVE CANDIDATE WHILE RUNOFF VOTERS SEE GENTNER DRUMMOND AS A MODERATE AND EVEN AS A LIBERAL.

- Nearly two-in-five runoff voters see Mazzei as very conservative, and another one-third see him as somewhat conservative.
- A plurality of runoff voters sees Drummond as a moderate and nearly one-in-five see him as a liberal. Just 39% see him as any kind of conservative.

Methodology

Pulse conducted a poll of n = 606 Republican primary runoff voters in Oklahoma. Data was collected June 21-23, 2026, by A combination of live telephone interviews and SMS-to-web interviews. 60% of the interviews were conducted using live calls to cell phones, 20% via SMS-to-web, and 20% via live calls to landlines. The sample was selected from the Oklahoma voter file and was stratified by age, gender, geography, educational attainment, and primary vote history. The survey has a margin of error of $\pm 4.0\%$ at the 95% confidence level.
